
CASEWORKER CORNER

Recently a gentleman, "Mark," came to NCM for assistance with his rent. The last few months were quite a struggle for him. Mark previously held a great position in a local industry for almost two decades but sadly was discharged from this job. The weight of this loss was immense.

Mark, at almost 60 years old, now faced eviction for the first time in his life.

When the NCM team first met Mark, his optimism and perseverance were astounding. Mark told us how he had recently lost three very close family members and only has one remaining nephew, who lives far from him. So, without any other outside support, Mark was alone in his situation. However, he gathered all the strength he had left and pushed forward, always staying positive and grateful. Mark secured a job working in a kitchen that was very physically demanding and still left him short on his bills. Unfortunately, Mark fell behind on his rent and was given a 30-day eviction notice. The NCM team was able to assist him with rent for one month so he could focus on his long-term plans. Mark worked diligently with the NCM casework team to apply for services such as Social Security Disability, Temporary Assistance with the Department of Social Services, and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program while awaiting his Unemployment Benefits decision. Thankfully, Mark's Unemployment benefits came through and would help cover the cost of his rent, moving him forward in a more positive mode. The NCM team is continuing to help Mark with other resources and services, but we are thankful he has a comfortable place to stay in the meantime!

There is no better feeling than being home. At its most basic, our home gives us shelter from the elements and a place to unwind and relax in safety. But home is much more than just shelter. Home is the foundation in which we create family traditions, celebrate our achievements, and support each other in times of sorrow. We strive to make our homes beautiful, loving places to share with our family and friends.

Currently affordable housing is sparce. This summer, NCM has seen unprecedented numbers in assistance for emergency housing and rental assistance. This June and July, the combined NCM casework team was able to advocate fifty-eight individuals and families in finding temporary shelter while they await a more permanent solution. Our casework team helped in advocating for 132 families with their current housing costs so they can stay in the homes they have already established.

Maintaining a home is another hurdle we see in our communities. Home repairs and utilities add up quickly and often take a back seat to rent, as well as food and medical bills for families with limited budgets. NCM is aiding many families with funds towards these services so our families can focus more on each other and less on where they will come up with the money to have their electricity, fuel for cooking, or needed medicine. As the need for affordable housing and home maintenance increases, our community knows they can rely on NCM to give a helping hand!
