## CASEWORKER CORNER

Our NCM casework team collaborates with multiple organizations within the community to ensure our clients receive the crisis help or long-term solutions they need. Recently, we partnered with Catholic Charities Domestic Violence Project to assist a young woman in a dire situation.

During one of our programs, a young woman entered our building and urgently requested to use the phone to contact the authorities. Her boyfriend had been arrested but was soon to be released, and she feared for her life. She had been hiding in the woods, seeking refuge until she found a safe place to make the call.

She arrived at our office hungry, shoeless, and in tears. Upon arrival, she approached the volunteers at our Clothing Center, asking to speak with a caseworker. Familiar with our services, she trusted that NCM and its caseworkers could guide her through the process of pressing charges against her boyfriend and finding a secure place to stay.

Our caseworker sprang into action immediately, contacting Catholic Charities. Within a few hours, the young woman was on her way to a safe location. Throughout the process, our caseworker arranged transportation and provided additional support, ensuring she left with clothing, food, counseling, and legal assistance.

Domestic violence is an unfortunate reality for many in our community, but there is hope. With the help of dedicated caseworkers and collaborative efforts with organizations like Catholic Charities, we can make a difference. Your support allows us to continue providing these crucial services and offers a lifeline to those in need.

Together, we can help individuals find safety and rebuild their lives.

**Brant Lake Food Pantry** Served 501 Households, 1,294 People 12% increase over the prior quarter

Warrensburg Food Pantry Served 476 Households, 1,196 People 16% increase over the prior quarter

Mobile Mart Food Pantry Served 122 Households, 246 People We started a 3rd route to incorporate those on our waitlist!

Casework Statistics

Served 315 Unique Clients Provided \$18,252 in Financial Assistance Our caseworker team provided 11 households with assistance in car insurance or repairs totaling \$2,680 in funding. Car insurance or repairs are up 50% over the Spring months of 2023.

> Furniture Program 158 Households received Furniture 49% increase over the prior quarter

Warrensburg & Brant Lake Clothing Center Saw 891 visitors, which provided clothes for 2,734 People 23% increase of visitors over the prior quarter
