NCM's roots are deeply embedded in those who founded this incredible organization. Sister Francesca Husselbeck was one of the first two original Co-Directors of North Country Ministry. She was sent to the North Country by the Albany Catholic Diocese, as they knew there was a need in the area but left it to her and Sister Mary to figure out what those needs were and how to go about meeting those needs. These two established this organization in 1992, creating the Gathering Place (a soup kitchen) that "only cost a smile" to attend, the Baby's Place and Play Group, as well as a Clothing Center to start. Sr. Fran's desire to be among the Adirondacks with her passion for hiking, combined with her calling to serve the people of the North Country, helped in the creation of an organization that is "for the Adirondack people, by the Adirondack people."

Sister Fran Husselbeck passed away peacefully on Sunday, January 19, 2025, in St. Peter's Hospital, Albany, after a brief battle with cancer. Her services were filled with those who loved her and whose lives she had forever changed. Beautiful memories were shared of her calling to serve the North Country and her passion and sense of accomplishment in the creation of North Country Ministry. As an organization, we owe all our gratitude and grace to this incredible woman whose passion brought her to this area and created this beautiful organization, "for the Adirondack people, by the Adirondack people." December is a season of joy, warmth, and togetherness. For many of us, it is a time to gather with loved ones, revel in the comfort of home, and celebrate the magic of the holidays. Yet, for some in our community, this season brings a stark reminder of struggles that weigh heavily on their shoulders. It is in these moments that the power of community and generosity shine brightly through our work at NCM.

This year, our Casework team had the privilege of assisting a resilient family of five facing unimaginable hardship. For months, they had been living out of their car—three little ones under the age of five, all cooped up with no beds to call their own. As the bitter cold of winter set in, the parents' anxiety grew. They were desperate to provide a sense of safety and warmth for their children.

When we met them, they had just moved into a small place to call home. It should have been a turning point, but life had more challenges in store. Their only vehicle broke down, leaving Dad unable to get to work. Their bills began to pile up, and just as hope seemed within reach, it felt as though it was slipping away again. With heavy hearts, they turned to NCM for help.

With the collaboration of other nonprofits and the remarkable generosity of a private donor, we were able to help them stay in their new home. Together, we stabilized their footing and gave them a renewed chance of a brighter future.
